
SNS REJUVENATION SIG – DECEMBER UPDATE

The SNS Rejuvenation SIG met on 30th November to discuss the previous month's actions and to look at how the workstreams have been progressing.

The Tight Gas Workgroup will be holding their next meeting in January. Here they will take the main themes derived from the Hackathon and devise business plans for each ensuring they are suitable for JIPs. The remaining topics are being taken forward by the OGTC at their call for ideas.

The UK/NL Best Practise Workgroup had no new activity to update. The group are currently looking into the possibilities and practicalities of a logistics sharing service in the region to reduce operating costs.

The Synergies between Renewables and E&P Workgroup have recently presented at Offshore Wind Week which was held at Orbis Energy in November. A workstream kick-off meeting is scheduled for 25th January 2018; here the group will aim to stimulate ideas surrounding logistics sharing, gas-to-wire and power-to-gas opportunities, and the development of common standards.

The Production Losses due to Salting Workstream held their initial kick-off meeting and attended the EBN salting forum which was held in Paris in November. The group have a second meeting scheduled for 1st February to maintain momentum on this topic with the aim to share knowledge and best practise.

Eric Marston of the Oil and Gas Authority summarised the need to identify the 'state of the Southern North Sea', rather than looking at the North Sea as a whole. The group agreed that EEEGR's SNS2018 conference which is due to be held on 28th February and 1st March 2018, would be the ideal opportunity to do this.

The group discussed the need to increase the promotion of the SNS Rejuvenation SIG and it was agreed that monthly statements would be produced by EEEGR to be appear on the EEEGR website.

The next meeting of the SNS Rejuvenation SIG will take place on 21st December 2017.
